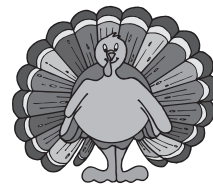

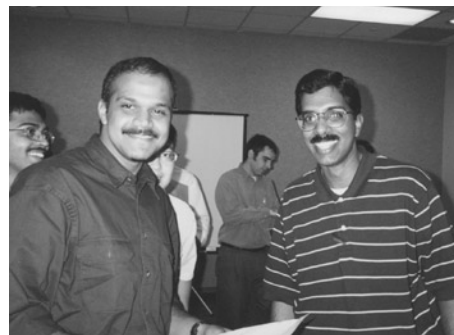


Frank and Danny share a smile after a very successful TBAG presentation.

Frank Kalpakis (URS Corporation) began the workshop with a presentation on *Using the Internet to Support the Efficient Transportation Decision Making (ETDM) Process*. Frank's presentation included a discussion on the history and current status of the ETDM process, particularly as it relates to inclusion in Long Range Transportation Plan updates. In addition, Frank addressed the use of the Internet in reviewing projects that fall under the ETDM category. Frank had to "fly solo" at the workshop

due a flight cancellation for his partner, Ruth Roaza (GIS Specialist with URS). We wish Ruth could have made the workshop, but Frank did a great job of covering the key points of ETDM.

Ram Pendyala (USF - College of Civil and Environmental Engineering) was our second presenter of the day. Ram presented on *FAMOS: Florida's Activity Mobility Simulator*. FAMOS is a modeling tool currently under development that simulates modifications made by individuals to their activity and travel patterns in response to changes in the transportation system.

Ram presented the specifics of FAMOS, as well as examples of the travel data that is being used to develop the model's parameters. The comparison of travel behavior between Miami and San Francisco was very interesting to the group. A big TBAG thank you to Ram for presenting at the workshop and for his contributions to the TBAG newsletter.

Our third presenter, Christopher Francis (FDOT-Central Office Systems Planning), had a last minute conflict and could not attend the workshop. Christopher was to present on *IDAS: ITS Deployment Analysis System*. We want to thank Christopher for spending the time to develop a presentation. Just a word of advice: keep that presentation handy because TBAG presenters don't get off that easily! We will be booking you again soon.
